What is a Soil Health Champion?

A Soil Health Champion is a farmer who has a strong sense of innovation when it comes to improving the health of their soil. They embody the principals of sustainable agriculture and natural resource management.

- These are farmers that strive for excellence in the food they produce and believe healthy soils are not an option - they are mandatory.
- They are the farmers of today who influence our farmers of tomorrow.

How to become a Soil Health Champion?

- Applicants need to complete the online nomination form at www.soilhealth.com.au/soil-health-champion. Nominees may provide their own submission or on behalf of someone else.
- Nominees will be contacted by their local regional NRM staff and asked a few simple questions over the phone regarding what they do, why they do it, what they achieve or hope to achieve and their future plans. The estimated time commitment is approximately 20 minutes.

What is required of a Soil Health Champion?

Once selected, Soil Health Champions will be asked to:

- Participate in a promotional video, filmed on their property. This video will be shown at Talkin' Soil Health and may also be used in other promotional materials.
- Attend the Talkin' Soil Health conference on 17 & 18 March 2022 in York, including conference cocktail party where their award will be presented. Champions will be provided with two conference tickets (including the cocktail party) meals and accommodation. Travel reimbursements provided with rates depending on your location/NRM region.

How will the applications be assessed?

Each regional NRM will establish their own assessment panel. Assessments will consider the applicant's demonstrated commitment to sustainable agriculture, natural resource management and improving the health of their soils.
